OUR TEAM



- In line with our Franciscan spirituality and Felician Core Values, we continue to prioritize Belonging and Equity for those we serve and for our caring team.
- Our goal is to have the most Certified Hospice and Palliative professionals in Michigan on our team. Angela Hospice currently employs 13.9% of the state's certified RNs, 33% of the state's certified LPNs, and 10.8% of Michigan's hospice and palliative care certified nurse aides.
- Our team members continue to advocate and

represent hospice and palliative care at the State and National level through active involvement with the Michigan Home Care & Hospice Association (MHHA) and National Hospice & Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO).

QUALITY & SERVICE

- Process improvements and departmental restructuring are increasing efficiency and teamwork, including implementation of the MVI Perfect Visit Model – incorporating hospice best practices for all caring disciplines.
- With our Care Center back to operating at pre-pandemic levels, we are grateful for the opportunity to serve more patients and families in this caring, peaceful environment.
- Our Grief Care team is working to customize in-person and virtual workshops to help our community understand the grief journey, how best to support one another, and themselves.
- Our robust Ethics Committee provides support and guidance in the many situations that occur in providing care at a complex, challenging time.

INNOVATION



- Our team developed and published resource books including Building Moments of Brilliance: A Caregiver's Guide to Dementia Care and Good Grief: A Guidebook for Spirituality, Health, and Connection in the Midst of Loss, for our colleagues, residents, and families in our partnering care facilities. Both books are also available to download free on our website.
- Angela's Virtual Assist (AVA) introduced a new "bring your own device" option, increasing access and use for our patients and their caregivers.




